We wish to offer our condolences over the death of the 4<sup>th</sup> Supreme Patriarch of the Unified Buddhist Church, the Most Venerable Thich Huyen Quang. He will be greatly missed.

While the loss of the Most Venerable Quang is greatly mourned, his numerous achievements over his lifetime offer hope as millions of Vietnamese continue in the same spirit of freedom and democracy.
